Board Meeting Minutes Tuesday January 24, 2023

The board meeting of the Friends of the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County was held on Tuesday, January 24, 2023, at the District headquarters.

Call to Order

Chairman Diane Addante called the meeting to order at 5:05 pm.

Roll Call

Present: Friends' Board members Diane Addante; Bob Watt; Carl Schultz; Penny Chanez; Karyn Charvat; Larry Larson, Ashley Guest arrived later in the meeting. Brian Battle was absent. Also present, Commissioner Jeff Gahris; District staff in attendance were Audra Bonnet, Lulú Hertenstein, Jeannine Kannegiesser, and Jonathan Mullen; and board candidates Mike Dyer, David Stang, and Joe Suchecki.

Approval of Minutes

The minutes from the November 24, 2022 Board of Directors Meeting were accepted as written by general consent and placed on file.

Board Chair Report

Mission Moment Jonathan Mullen, the District's Multimedia Content Coordinator showed a video to give the board some tips for amplifying our Friends' messages on social media. Board members are urged to share their photos with Lulú via email so the Friends' perspective can be present in our stories and posts.

 Introduction of staff and guests Chairman Addante reported Cari Mertes will be taking on the finance role with the Friends. Diane introduced three board candidates and asked them to tell the board a bit about themselves:
 Mike Dyer is with Edward Jones, one of our 2022 community partners. His appreciation of nature drew him to the Friends. He looks forward to working with our Finance Committee.

David Stang is a current volunteer steward at Fullersburg Woods and President of Stang

Capital Advisory, LLC. The combination of his interest in giving back to nature and business experience will be a good fit for our Development Committee. **Joe Suchecki** is the longtime steward for the Springbrook Prairie and connected with the DuPage Birding Club. He is interested in promoting fundraising by sharing his experiences as a District volunteer and helping grow connections with foundations.

- **Board Giving** Chairman Addante noted that one indicator of board engagement is its own giving to the cause served. She was pleased to announce that all members of the Board made a financial contribution in 2022.
- Ambassadors Circle 2022 Reported there were 536 donors that gave at least \$100, compared to 503 in 2021 (giving \$100-2,499) 22 Community Partners compared to 17 in 2021 (donors giving \$2,500+). The total number of donors for 2022 was 1,095 compared to 987 in 2021. We hit our goal of 40% retention from 2021 to 2022. We had more than 500 new contributors in 2022.
- Giving Tuesday Total giving on November 29 was \$16,888.75. A portion of that was from board matching gifts. Number of donors on Giving Tuesday has been declining since 2020(97 in 2020; 78 in 2021; 53 in 2022). This reflects some wider trends around donor participation and may be related to widespread adoption of Giving Tuesday by other charitable organizations.
- Year-end Appeal Our year-end appeal gifts totaled \$76,846 by 12/31/2022. We are grateful to Navistar for their \$20,000 challenge, which will be directed to support exhibit development at Willowbrook.

- **Nomination of Ashley Guest for a second board term** Larry Larson moved to approve, motion was seconded. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.
- **Nomination of Mike Dyer for board of directors** Karyn Charvat moved to approve, motion was seconded. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.
- **Nomination of David Stang for board of directors** Penny Chanez moved to approve, motion was seconded. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.
- **Nomination of Joe Suchecki for board of directors** Larry Larson moved to approve, seconded by Karyn Charvat. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

- Plan for updating organizing documents through the year it is a good practice to review organizing documents regularly. Please review the bylaws provided in the board packet. Recommendations for bylaw updates will be included at our March meeting. Once we have completed the bylaws review, we will go through our other documents.

- Acceptance of Financial Dashboard Summary and the Profit & Loss Budget to Actual Report through Dec. 31, 2022, We have a total net assets of \$911,764.96. In 2022, net income was \$187,400. We transferred \$282,887 to the District. We have \$230,403 in unrestricted funds and \$681,361 in restricted funds in our balance. Karyn Charvat moved to accept, seconded by Penny Chanez. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.
- Motion to approve transfers to the District Motion to approve total requests of \$1,714.02 for the following items. The District is requesting funds for our QuickBooks Renewal (\$915.00), to cover Friends advertising and printing expenses (\$417.68) and to cover Friends Q4 2022 postage for items posted on the Friends behalf by the District (\$381.34) Larry Larson moved to approve, seconded by Karyn Charvat. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.
- Motion to approve 2023 Friends' Budget The budget was circulated at our November Board meeting. Total income is budgeted at \$704,500 and total expenses at \$1.1 million, Which reflects transfers anticipated to the District of \$822,000. Two minor updates were the Districts in-kind professional services were revised to reflect actual investment of staff time serving as staff of the Friends and the additional account 65010 was added with the expense for QuickBooks charged to the foundation. Karyn Charvat moved to approve, seconded by Larry Larson. The motion carried by a unanimous vote.

 - Wild Things 2/25 This is a conference with around 2,000 attendees.
 Friends is setting up in the exhibition hall with a table of information about our forest preserve district. All are welcome to attend.
 - District hosted Legislative breakfast with good turnout of elected officials, including Rep. Sean Casten whose advocacy on behalf of the Forest Preserve District resulted in a \$2M federal grant for Willowbrook.
 - Restoration project underway Restoration at Babcock Grove has received the 400+ hours of volunteer time to activate the first \$4,000 of the matching grant from the Illinois Clean Energy Community Foundation.
 - Audit We are required to do an audit this year as we raised more than \$300,000 in 2022.
 - **Public Input Survey** The District is considering a public input survey and may request some money to help fund the survey.
- Commissioner Jeff Gahris
 - **Special permits** Willowbrook Main Hospital needs special use permits from Glen Ellyn. The District is in the process of obtaining them.
 - **Blanding Turtle Program** The program has a new partner. Phillip's Park Zoo in Aurora will now participate in the Blanding's Turtle Program.
- West Suburban Food Bank Larry Larson reported on the pilot program starting with receiving 32 lbs. of oranges and 24 lbs. of carrots for Willowbrook.
